
Before reading...

1. Here Comes Charlie AND Mr Willy Wonk's Factory

Vocabulary

- Think of a synonym for 'gorgeous'.

Infer

- What food did the family eat? Why did they only eat these foods?
- Why did they only get 'second helpings' on Sundays?
- Why would Charlie slow down when he walked past the chocolate factory?
- Why is Willy Wonka such an amazing chocolatier?
- Why did the family love George?

Predict

- Will the family stay poor?
- What will happen on Charlie's birthday this year?
- What did the Prince do?

Explain

- What emotions do you feel towards Charlie and his family?
- What is the effect of the line 'And oh, how he wished he could go inside the factory and see what it was like!'? How is it ironic?
- What impression do we get of the chocolate factory?
- Why did Charlie always go into the room of his four grandparents?
- What made Grandpa Joe feel young again?

Retrieve

- What are the grandparents' names?
- How many people are in the Bucket family?
- When did Charlie get to taste chocolate?
- What was Mr. Bucket's job?
- What was 'the most terrible torturing thing you could imagine'?
- What is the name of the Prince?

- Sum up Charlie's family in one word.
- Sum up how the reader feels after reading these chapters in one word.

2. Mr Wonka and the Indian Prince AND The Secret Workers

- What is a spy?

Infer

- Why did Mr Wonka tell the Prince to eat the house right away?
- Why does Charlie's mum call him away?
- How do the chocolate and sweets leave the factory?

Predict

- Why is the factory gate always closed?
- What kind of people work in the factory?
- How will the 'lucky few' be chosen?

Explain

- How does Dahl build suspense when Grandpa tells the story?
- How would Charlie feel as he listens to the story of the Indian Prince?
- Why would Charlie ask whether the story was true?

Retrieve

- What was the palace made out of?
- Why did the palace melt?
- How many rooms are in the palace?
- Why did the factory close down?
- What are the three other factory owners called?

- Summarise how Grandpa feels when he tells his stories in one word.
- Summarise how Charlie would feel when he read the headline in one word.

- What is the name of the person who finds the first ticket?
- What is the name of the person who finds the second ticket?

- Summarise Veruca in one word.
- Describe how Charlie would feel when he thought about the ticket in one word.

4. Charlie's Birthday and Two More Golden Tickets Found

- Who finds the third ticket?
- Who finds the fourth ticket?
- What's the name of Violet's best friend?
- What world record in Violet trying to get?
- How old is Mike?

- Describe Violet in one word.
- Describe Mike in one word.
- How would Charlie feel? Summarise in one word.

5. Grandpa Joe Takes a Gamble AND The Family Begins to Starve

- Define 'automatically'.
- What is 'hardship?
- What is a synonym for 'luscious'?

Infer

- Why do they open the bar together?
- Why would Charlie eat the chocolate bar in the shop?
- Why did Charlie check if someone had lost the money?
- Why does Charlie begin to look like a 'skeleton'?

Predict

- Will the ticket be found in the bar?
- Will Charlie give the money to his mother?
- How will the family react when they hear he has found money?

Explain

- How does Dahl build suspense when they are opening the bar?
- Why is 'WHOLE' and 'FOOD' in capital letters?

Retrieve

- What does Grandpa Joe get Charlie?
- How much money falls out of Grandpa's purse?
- How long was Charlie gone for?
- How many feet of snow is around the house?
- How much money does Charlie find?

- Describe how Charlie's family feels in one word.
- Summarise how Charlie would feel when he finds the money in one word.
