Writing Lessons (Stage 2)

Aims of the lessons

- ★ Develop the students' writing skills.
- ★ Teach students how to produce **sophisticated and compelling** writing across a **variety of forms** (i.e. creative fiction, persuasive writing, non-fiction writing).
- **Excite and encourage** students to continue reading and practicing their writing skills.
- ★ Engage students in class discussion to build both the skills as an individual and as a team player.
- ★ Offer students personalised feedback and help them build their strengths and improve their weaknesses.

Lesson Structure

Over the course of the programme we will focus on a wide variety of different forms of writing. In the lessons we will look at examples, learn techniques, brainstorm ideas as a group, and complete writing tasks. Below is an example of what we will be covering over the course of the programme:

- → Lesson 1: Creative writing: opening your story.
- → Lesson 1: Creative writing: creating setting.
- → Lesson 2: Creative writing: creating character.
- → Lesson 3: Creative writing: building tension and excitement.
- → Lesson 5: Creative writing: using perspective and narration.
- → Lesson 6: Creative writing: choosing your book title, chapter titles, and character names.
- → Lesson 7: Creative writing: ending your story.
- → Lesson 8: Writing poetry (A)
- → Lesson 9: Writing poetry (B)
- → Lesson 10: Writing play scenes.
- → Lesson 11: Consolidating and improving our writing skills.

Homework and assessment

Along with completing tasks during the lessons, students will be set a **homework** task to do for each topic. This work will be **carefully marked** and students will receive **detailed feedback** which will highlight **what they did well**, **where they can improve**, and **corrections on spelling and grammar**.
